Fabric Requirements

Cutting Instructions – WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A Panel – Multi 2250P-11 1 panel

Fussy cut 1 – 22½" x 43½" strip (approximate)

Fabric B Just Color! 1351-Cream 3/4 yard

• Cut 3 – $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, end-to-end, and cut 2 – $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric C Just Color! 1351-Seaglass 1 yard

- Cut 2 2½" x WOF strips.
- Cut 2 4" x 261/2" strips.
- Cut 1 6% x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into 2 6% squares.
- Cut 2 7¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strip into 7 – 7¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (28) small triangles.

Fabric D Just Color! 1351-Red ½ yard

- Cut 1 6%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into 2 6%" squares.
- Cut 1 7¼" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strip into 4 – 7¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (16) small triangles. You will only need (14) of the triangles.
- See instructions to cut 20 berries.

Fabric E Just Color! 1351-Chambray ½ yard

 Cut 2 – 6%" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into 7 – 6%" squares. Cut the squares across one diagonal to make (14) large triangles.

Fabric F Just Color! 1351-Orange % yard

- Cut 1 7¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into 4 – 7¼" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (16) small triangles. You will only need (14) of the triangles.
- Cut 6 21/2" x WOF strips for the binding.
- See instruction to cut 16 berries.

Fabric G Just Color! 1351-Grass ½ yard

- Cut 2 6% x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into 7 6% squares. Cut the squares across one diagonal to make (14) large triangles.
- See instructions to cut 14 leaves.

Fabric H Just Color! 1351-Lime 1/8 yard

· See instructions to cut 24 - leaves.

Fabric I Just Color! 1351-Green 1/8 yard

• See instructions to cut 2 – \%" x 54" bias strips.

Backing Just Color! 1351-Seaglass 31/4 yards

• Cut 2 – 56" x WOF strips.

Additional Supplies


Batting 56" x 68" Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

Sewing Instructions

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Press seams towards the darker fabric, unless otherwise indicated.

Blocks

- 1. Sew one 2½" x 43½" Fabric C strip to each side of the 22½" x 43½" Fabric A panel. Sew one 4" x 26½" Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the panel to 24½" x 48½" (Fig. 1).
- 2. Sew one 6½" x 48½" Fabric B strip to each side of the panel.
- 3. Following the manufacturer's instructions, press fusible web onto the wrong side of Fabric I. Using your favorite method, cut enough 3/8" strips from the bias (45 degree angle across the fabric) to make two 54" long strips.



- 5. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines. See templates on page 4.

- 7. Refer to the quilt photo to arrange and press twelve Fabric H leaves, seven Fabric G leaves, ten Fabric D berries and eight Fabric F berries onto one 6½"x 48½" Fabric I strip. Repeat with the second Fabric I strip.
- 8. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to complete the center block.
- 9. Place one 6%" Fabric C Square on top of one 6%" Fabric D Square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make two C/D units (Fig. 4). Trim C/D units to measure 61/2" square. Repeat to make four C/D units total.







10. Follow Figure 5 and sew one Fabric C small triangle, one Fabric F small triangle and one Fabric E large triangle together to make one Block One. Repeat to make fourteen of Block One. Trim each block to 6½" square.

11. Follow Figure 6 and sew one Fabric C small triangle, one Fabric D small triangle and one Fabric G large triangle together to make one Block Two. Repeat to make fourteen of Block Two. Trim each block to 6½" square.

Quilt Top

(Refer to Figure 9 - the quilt layout while assembling)

- 12. Sew four Block Ones and four Block Twos together to make one side border. Repeat to make a second side border. Sew the borders to each side of the Center Block.
- 13. Sew two C/D units, three Block Ones and three Block Twos together to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

- 14. Sew the two 56" x WOF strips together and trim to make one 56" x 68" backing piece.
- 15. Press the quilt top and backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

16. Cut the ends of the six binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end-to-end to make one continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.


