# Terrycloth Tumbler

Approximately 36" × 46"

**Read all of the instructions before you begin to cut or sew**. WOF means width of fabric, the part from selvage to selvage. All measurements include a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise specified. Sew with right sides together, unless otherwise noted. Press all seams after sewing.

What you need:	
Blue terrycloth	5/8yard
Pink terrycloth	5/8 yard
White terrycloth	5/8 yard
Pink flannel 1	3/8 yard
Pink flannel 2	3/8 yard
Lavender flannel 1	3/8 yard
Lavender flannel 2	3/8 yard
Green flannel	3/8 yard
Yellow flannel	3/8 yard
White flannel	3/8 yard
Flannel for binding	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> yard

#### Cutting:

This is a very scrappy quilt that allows you to use your creativity and make a one of a kind baby quilt. Instructions are intended to be general.

1. From each color of terrycloth, cut strips the following size by w.o.f:

2-1/2"	(top & bottom borders)
2″	(side borders)
1-3/4"	(upper & lower sashings)
2-1/4"	(middle sashing)

- 2. Cut remaining terry cloth and all flannel on the fold. This will give you 20 pieces of terry & flannel fabric approximately 13-1/2" x 21".
- 3. Cut these fabrics into strips 21" long in varying widths ranging from 1-1/2" to 5-1/2".
- 4. Cut flannel for binding (5) 3" strips. (You may choose to use 2-1/2" strip or some other size. Because we had terrycloth backing we cut the strip a little wider to accommodate the heavier weight).

#### Assembly

1. Using strips of various widths and fabrics, sew the strips together making strip sets that are 11 - 13" wide. Make 10 strip sets.

- 2. Using the template provided (or a 22.5 wedge ruler), cut 52 blocks. You can stagger the templates on the fabric strips. They don't all have to be cut the same.
- 3. Sew the blocks together into 4 rows, 13 blocks per row, rotating every other block.
- 4. Square up the rows into lengths about 34". The length isn't important as long as all are the same length.
- 5. Use the 1-3/4" top and bottom sashing strips, sew 2 random lengths together to make the upper sashing. It needs to be the length of your rows of blocks. Repeat using a different combination of fabrics for lower sashing.
- 6. Repeat using the 2-1/4" strips of terrycloth to make the center sashing.
- 7. Assemble the quilt by placing the pieces in the following order: Row of blocks, top sashing, row of blocks, middle sashing, row of blocks, bottom sashing, row of blocks.
- 8. Using the same technique as above and the 2" strips, assemble the side borders of the quilt. They should measure the length of the quilt. Join them to the quilt.
- 9. Once again using the same technique and the 2-1/2" strips, assemble and join the top and bottom borders.

## Finish It

- 1. Sandwich and quilt as desired. We used a cloud motif.
- 2. Piece together the binding strips on the diagonal.
- 3. Bind your quilt.

### You now have an adorable baby quilt to keep or gift!
